The Tinker Foundation is pleased to announce that Caroline Boyd Kronley will succeed Renate Rennie as its next President. Renate is retiring after 45 years in a variety of roles at the Foundation. Caroline, who is currently Managing Director of Strategy at the Rockefeller Foundation, will join the Foundation later this year.

“This is an important inflection point for Tinker,” said Alan Stoga, Chairman of the Board. “Renate has done an outstanding job evolving the work that was started by Martha Muse, who implemented Edward Larocque Tinker’s vision that the freedom and prosperity of the peoples of the Americas depended upon their mutual trust, friendship and cooperation.
